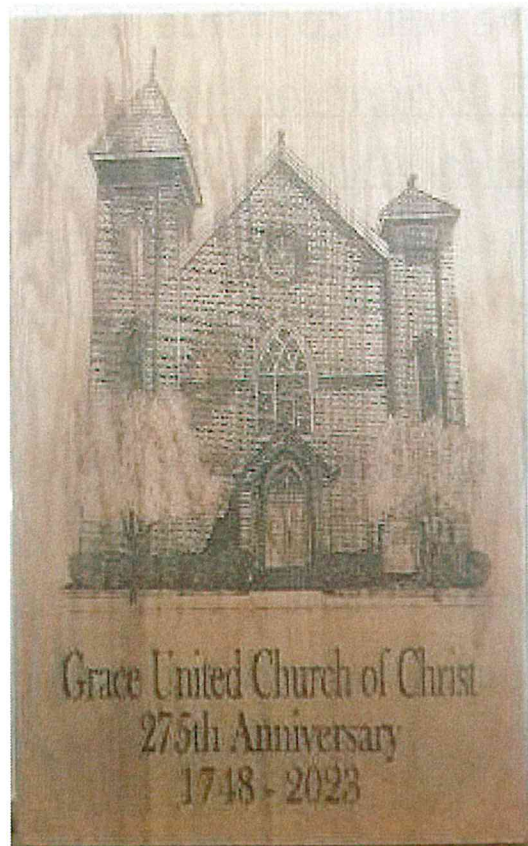

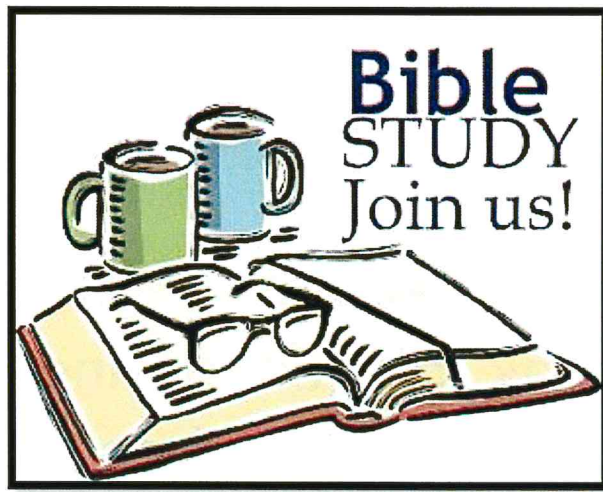

Cemetery History Presentation

It is a pleasure and an honor to announce that I will be giving a presentation on our German Reformed Cemetery on South Carlisle Street during two upcoming Church services: October 1st and 8th. My talk will touch on the history of the cemetery, as well as the 9-year project to preserve, repair, research and make available that family history to descendants worldwide. It has been an interesting project discovering long buried/damaged headstones, reading/recording the headstones, and finding relatives and relationships with folks not only buried in our cemetery but also spread throughout the USA.

Many of you know of my German Reformed Cemetery book that was published several years ago. Since then, more headstones have been discovered and repaired and researched and added to a second edition of the Cemetery book that is about to be published.

My research for the cemetery has found historic gems that surprise and add a wonderful history to our town of Greencastle. My wife, Susan ("Fred"), and I share a love of historical projects, so we would love to have anyone stop by and say hi and visit the cemetery. If you come by 131 S. Carlisle (our house next to the cemetery) and if there are two Alaska licensed vehicles parked in the back, stop in, and get a guided tour of the Cemetery.

We enjoy fellowship and refreshments following worship services on the second Sunday of each month, held in our social hall.

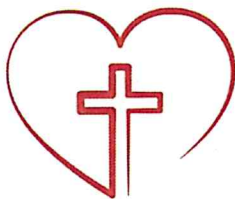

Chancel Choir

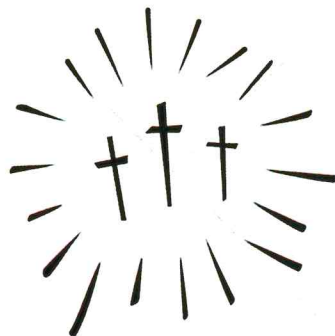

We are happy to announce the profits we made through our summer fundraising efforts:

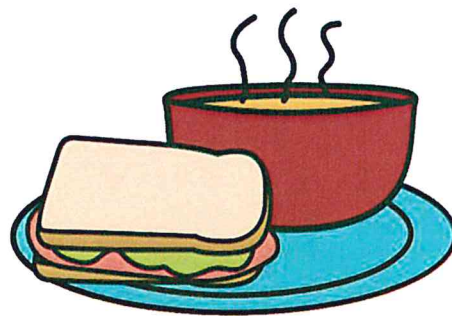

Live streaming of our services will continue to be available on our Facebook page for those who are unable to attend in person.

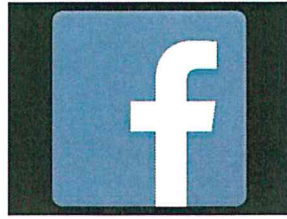

DISCUSSION TOPICS:

1. Purchasing LED light bulbs to replace the lights in hallways and social hall. The approximate cost is \$650.00 to \$700.00. It was passed on a Deb/Chet motion with Mark and Tim getting finale pricing and Mark and crew installing.
2. The “shields” are removed, and the foyer is painted (thank you Mark and Kate). Cy Anderson was contacted since his mother, Elva Anderson, painted them and he does not want them.
3. The hallway and trim needs a fresh coat of paint. Volunteers are needed to help with this project.
4. The carpet in the hallways are in need of help. It will be replaced with wood flooring like the back foyer, approximate cost \$5200.00. There are some anonymous donations to cover the cost of some of the paint and carpet, but we still need more money. We are going to inform the congregation of these projects to see if we can get more donations to cover these projects.
5. Cathy has a contact that provides an electricity evaluation of costs to get the cheapest rate on a yearly basis. There is no cost to the church. We gave her ok to look into this.

6. New electrical outlet installed in sanctuary where camera is set up, will cost \$332.82. This was approved as people coming off the elevator into sanctuary need to step over cord and it is a tripping hazard.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

- The landscaping project in the front of the church is completed and looks fabulous. This project was funded by Ron and Jan Shafer and done by Rigo. Rigo will be attending services next Sunday and both he and the Shafer's will be recognized for this undertaking.
- Orkin Pest Control will be doing the annual inspection on Monday, July 31st between 8 and 10 am. Any concerns, please inform Elaine before then.
- New security signs from Dynmark/Atlantic Security were received and Tom Stine will be putting up the new one at the mailbox and the other one was replaced in the front of the church.
- Beaver Mechanical will be at the church on Tuesday, August 1st at 7 am to clean the boiler and fix the leak on the condensate pipe in the basement.
- The flower committee is looking at getting grapevine wreaths to hang in the sanctuary between the windows where there are "dirty" remnants of Christmas wreaths. More info to follow.
- Jack Webb will be getting in touch with the church regarding the publishing cost of his newest book about the cemetery. He is to be providing a quote when he returns from Alaska and is hoping the church can use some money from the cemetery fund to launch this project.
- No church picnic this year but we will have refreshments/fellowship on September 10th after service. The VFW ladies auxiliary will be using the Social Hall on September 10th from 1:30 to 4:30.

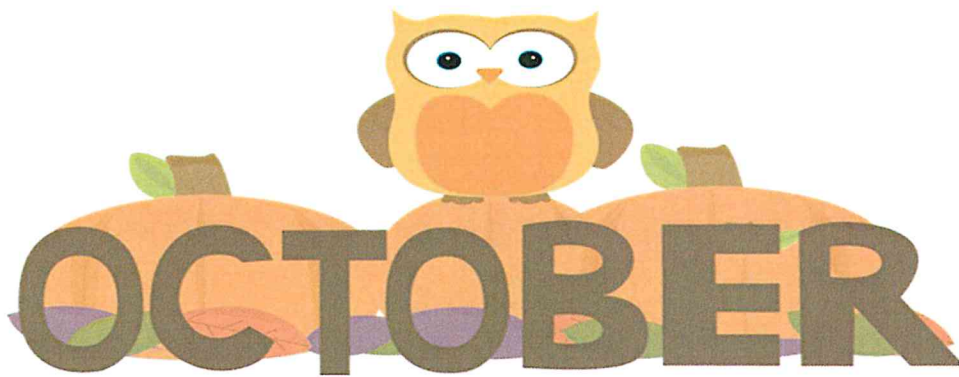
