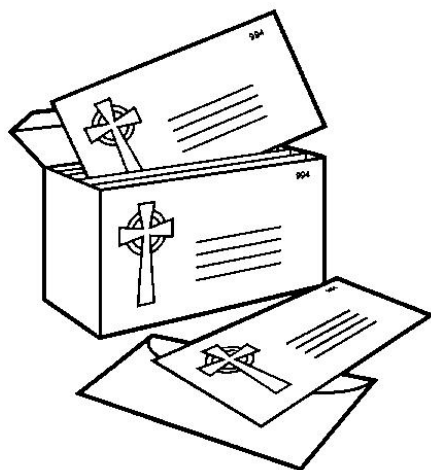

## **August 16, 2020**

**Roll Call:** Margaret Stouffer, Jeff Stouffer, Steve Miller, Mark Stahl, Carolyn Shoemaker, Mark Ruzicka, Larry Stepler, Lu Miller

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am by President Margaret Stouffer.

**Devotions:** Prayer was given by Pastor Mark Ruzicka.

Motion by C. Shoemaker/M Stahl to add two items to the agenda. Passed unanimously.

**Work of the Church:** Reopening of the church remains the same with the guidelines established at the last meeting. Thermometers were purchased for Grace's Closet.

**Consent Agenda:** Motion to accept/approve the consent agenda by M. Stouffer/ J. Stouffer passed unanimously.

**Information Agenda:** Information from Conference, Nora Foust – the interview with Pastor Brenda has happened. A report will be generated to be reviewed by Brenda, then submitted to the ministry.

**Building and Grounds:** Atlantic Security has repaired the faulty panel. Parsonage update – John Lehman is scheduled to start repairs to the parsonage in approximately 2 weeks. He also looked at the ceiling outside sanctuary. It was recommended drywall be hung, painted and trim. Cost of \$3075. A second estimate will be obtained.

**Church Picnic:** To be held Sept. 20 at Citizens pavilion. Chicken will be provided and those planning on attending are to bring their own bagged sides and drinks. There will be no activities this year, but bring lawn chairs for after the meal.

Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting is August 29. Pastor Mark and Margaret Stouffer will attend virtually. If anyone else is interested in attending, please contact Margaret.

Called to Care Training and Consistory Handbook: Tabled.

**Action Agenda:**

Building and Grounds: A computer will eventually need to be purchased to stream services. Currently we are using personal laptop of Steve Miller.

Finance Committee – Richard Holzapfel, CFP from Morgan Stanley, Hagerstown spoke to the group explaining the investments Grace Church has currently.

PPP Loan does not need to be applied for at this time.

The meeting was adjourned on a motion by J. Stouffer/ C. Shoemaker at 9:30 with the Lord's Prayer

Next Meeting September 27 at 8:30. This is a week later due to the church picnic being on September 20.

## Consistory Minutes of Meeting

September 27, 2020

**Roll Call:** Margaret Stouffer, Steve Miller, Jeff Stouffer, Carolyn Shoemaker, Mark Stahl, Sydnae Vanner, Larry Stepler, Mark Ruzicka, Lu Miller

The meeting was called to order at 8:35 am by President Margaret Stouffer.

**Devotions:** Prayer was given by Pastor Mark Ruzicka.

**Work of the Church:** Reopening of the church guidelines remains the same.

Motion by M. Stouffer/C. Shoemaker to add the Parsonage Rental to the Information Agenda passed unanimously.

**Consent Agenda:** Motion to accept the items in the consent agenda by J. Stouffer/S. Vanner passed unanimously.

### **Information Agenda:**

1. Margaret and Sydnae met with the conference committee regarding interview with Pastor Brenda. They were asked to clarify some questions the members had. The committee also informed Margaret and Sydnae that they could be relied upon for input and guidance moving forward. Nora Foust was unavailable for an additional update.
2. PPP Loan has undergone another cycle of changes. Applications are not being accepted yet. BB&T bank will let Larry know when to apply.
3. The insurance company offered to do a review of our policy.

4. Choir – The consistory has no objection to the choir starting practices and performances following social distancing policies.
5. Outreach programs that include food will continue as a “grab and go”. Congregational gatherings in the Social Hall involving the Christmas decorating luncheon on November 22 will still be held with proper social distancing and wearing of masks when up and walking around.
6. Margaret and Sydnae will resume reviewing of consistory booklets, rental and wedding policies.
7. Steve will follow up on the license for live streaming.
8. A laptop has been purchased and fully funded through donations for streaming the services and is being put to use currently.
9. Tabled for later: Called to Care training.
10. It was asked to consider having the church picnic for next year earlier in the year. This was tabled for a later meeting.
11. Parsonage sale/rental - There is a person interested in buying the parsonage. There is also a person interested in doing a “Rent to Own” option. Once the repairs are finished, the consistory will need to decide to either sell the parsonage or rent it or the “Rent to Own” option.

### **Action Agenda:**

1. Repair to the floors is to start on Monday, September 28.
2. Bills for Mt. Tabor Construction for repair to the walls totaled \$6531.20. The engineer’s report that needed to be completed before repair could start totaled \$3826.50. Jeff will be contacting Mt. Tabor regarding the engineer’s report which seemed high and ask for an itemized statement to better understand the cost. It was

decided this would need to be put to the congregation for transparency.

3. Repair of ceiling outside the Sanctuary – We received 2 quotes. A verbal quote from John Lehman (Mt. Tabor Construction) at \$3075. This involves putting drywall over the current tiles. The other quote from Artisan Drywall came in at \$11,690. This quote included removing the existing tiles, putting up new drywall ceiling, and painting. Artisan was asked for a quote for putting drywall over the existing tiles, however this would void any warranty. Mt. Tabor will be asked to have their drywall person look at the ceiling and give another quote with removing the tiles. Mark and Steve will follow up on these items.
4. The roof above the ceiling to be repaired was discussed. When the roof was repaired earlier this year, we were told it will eventually need to be replaced. Should the roof be repaired before the repair to the ceiling to prevent any more leaks? Steve and Mark will also follow up on this question.
5. The double car garage is available for rent, however, there is an interested party looking at it.
6. Pastor Mark wanted to make consistory aware that his call agreement will be up for renewal in January.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:35 am with the Lord's Prayer.

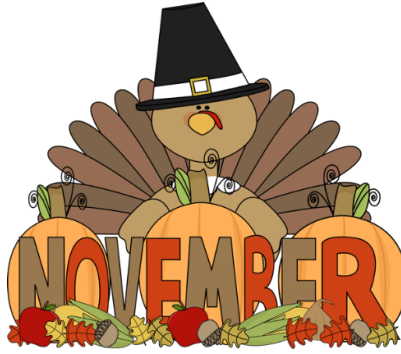
